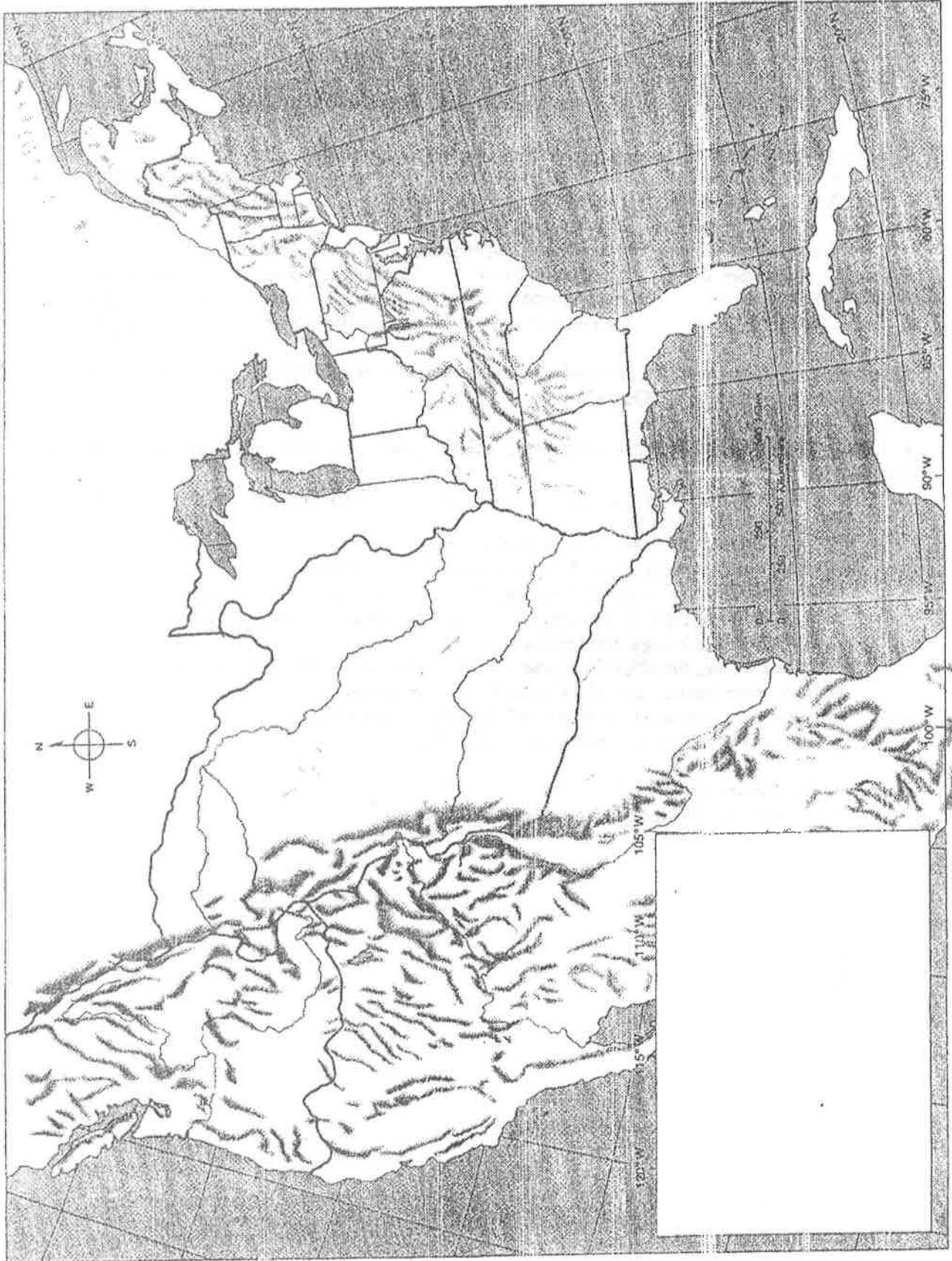

 - A. Before 1803, this nation's eastern and western boundaries were defined by the Atlantic Ocean and the Mississippi River.
 - B. Jefferson sent representatives to France to buy this city.
 - C. This mountain range is North America's continental divide.
 - D. This territory was claimed by Britain, Russia, Spain, and the United States.
 - E. Napoleon sold the U.S. this territory in order to finance his European wars.
 - F. Lewis and Clark began their expedition from this city.
 - G. St. Augustine, the oldest European settlement in the U.S., was in this territory.
 - H. Sacagawea became part of the expedition at this place.
 - I. Lewis and Clark spent the winter of 1805-1806 at this site.
 - J. This natural feature is named after Zebulon Pike.
